

Fact Sheet

Bethlehem House fosters an environment focused on healthy family life. Our house is not a shelter: it is a home.

Many of our expecting moms are not first-time mothers. While staying at Bethlehem House, they work to reunite with their children.

At full capacity, our home can accommodate up to eleven women.

Bethlehem House provides 24-hour staff support.

Each resident is provided with her own room, utilities, toiletries and child care necessities at no cost.

Each woman works with staff to determine long-term goals, including finding permanent and affordable housing.

If a woman does not have her GED upon transition into our home, she must attain it while staying as a resident.

Bethlehem House has a chapel and hosts Mass weekly. Residents are welcome to attend, not required.

Mom and her baby are welcome to stay in our home up to 15 weeks after baby is born.

Since Bethlehem House opened its doors in 2005, over 150 women have stayed in our home.

95% of our guests do not know what a healthy family looks like, feels like or functions like.

80% of our guests have no knowledge of or relationship with their father.

45% of our guests have aged out of the Nebraska Foster Care System and have found themselves pregnant and homeless within two years.

Bethlehem House is 100% drug free.

75% of our guests are able to secure permanent, affordable housing after their stay at our home.

100% of our guests choose life under the most stressful circumstances.
